ANNUAL DINNER

Due to the gales, attendance was well down at our 30th Annual Fundraising Dinner held at the New Loon Fung Restaurant in Chinatown on 9th February. A small profit of £170 was made. However, donations amounting to £360 were subsequently received from many who were unable to attend. Of the donations, £320 were gift-aided which will yield a tax rebate of £80 from HMRC. This makes an overall total of £610 (£360 + £80 + £170) - more than the profit we might have made had everyone attended! (Every cloud...)

2019 AGM (22 November 2019)

Paid-up membership was 107. Asst. Treasurer Praveen Hanoman reported that Independent Examiner Carl Warren had confirmed that the accounts complied with the Charity Commission's latest requirements. Although, under the Commission's rules, the amount of the Association's income was insufficient to require an independent examiner, the Committee nevertheless felt that this was desirable.

Donations to the school during the year amounted to £2000 for improvements to the sports ground. A shipment of school ties was also sent, the cost of which was reimbursed by QCOSA. There had been a loss on the Association's 30th Anniversary Dinner-Dance, but the summer Boat Cruise had made a record profit. As in the previous year, the Cruise had been promoted by Dalgety's Teas, which helped to boost numbers.

QCOSA

QCOSA was reconstituted at an Extra-ordinary General Meeting held at Queen's College on Sunday 13th October. The new executive comprises 14 members, with President Dr. Arron Fraser, 1st and 2nd vice-Presidents Pauline Chase and Vidushi Persaud-McKinnon respectively, and Secretary Martina McDonald-Johnson. The members thanked outgoing Secretary, and Chair of the proceedings, Ms. Sharon Singh-Kreuter for her dedicated service over the years. The UK association also extends its thanks to Sharon, who has been a steadfast conduit for correspondence between QCOGA(UK) and QCOSA during her many years as QCOSA Secretary and organiser of the Special Needs Programme.

175th ANNIVERSARY REUNION (27 October 2019 - 3 November 2019)

Mark Dalgety and Christopher Chunnilall represented the Association at the 175th (Dodransbicentennial) Anniversary celebrations in Guyana.

An **ICQC** business meeting was held on Monday 28 October at Herdmanston Lodge. The following were the key items reported or agreed:

- The Central Florida Chapter is dormant. The Central & South Florida chapters will consider merging.
- The ICQC Reunion Facebook channel set up by Mike Annamunthadoo (Toronto Chapter) can be used to build communications with the alumni community.
- The Centre of Excellence for Creative Arts a 5-person sub-committee was set up (including UK Committee Mark Dalgety). Mark has submitted a business plan for the sub-committee's consideration.
- Re-establishment of the Cadet Corps. A 3-person committee was set up to identify ways forward, and asked to report back by March 2020.
- The sports ground is returning to a suitable state with the support of the 'Grass Cutter organisation'. However, it needs to be maintained at the time of the meeting, the groundsman only prepared the cricket pitch, and the Min. of Education does not want to get an assistant groundsman.
- A games master / mistress is needed, as well as a music teacher.
- A sub-committee was formed to consider a strategy for the sports/ground/pavilion and asked to report back by April 2020.
- The Board of Governors is having discussions on the excessive number of subjects (up to 20!) being taken at CAPE (the old 'O' Level). (St Stanislaus has proposed a 'back to basics' programme for its students of 10-12 subjects).
- There are between nine and eleven students on the Special Needs Programme.
- The ICQC Committee term will run for two years. The 2021 meeting scheduled to be held in Toronto around the time of Caribana, with subsequent meetings held annually.

- The new Committee comprises: President (by default, as Chair/President of host Association) Dr. Arron Fraser, Exec. Secretary Eden Gajraj, Deputy Sec. Gerald Alleyne, Recording Sec. Victor Moses, Funding & project co-ordinator Martina McDonald-Johnson.
- Alfred Granger, retiring Executive Secretary, was thanked for his efforts on behalf of ICQC.

OBITUARIES

DEREK G HUGH

A stalwart supporter of the Association, and its first Life Member, Derek joined in 1988 and served on the Committee between 1990 and 2002, holding the posts of Secretary and of Chairman during that period. He was made a Vice-President in 2004 and served as President for five years from 2014–15 to 2018–19. However, because of health problems he declined to stand for the presidency at last year's AGM and was re-appointed as a Vice-President.

Derek was admitted to QC's First Form (in those days the pre-11-plus form) in 1946. He was, to put it mildly, a somewhat wild character at school, even managing to get into a fight and be caned by Becks* on his first day! (He probably won the fight as well.) I remember him as the demon fast bowler in the Raleigh House second XI (of which I was captain, though not through any particular ability as a player). He would begin his run-up from the boundary ending with a delivery that sometimes beat both batsman and wicketkeeper bequeathing four byes to our opponents. He also possessed a bicycle with a 'constant' (fixed wheel) drive and no brakes.

Following O-levels in 1952, Derek returned to England, the land of his birth, and found his feet in the engineering industry. He progressed to hold a senior position with Foster Wheeler Power Products, and became a Chartered Engineer, a Fellow (i.e. senior member) of the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, and a Member of the Institution of Civil Engineers and of other engineering institutions.

Derek was also a senior Freemason, being a member of various lodges in the UK, and Provincial Grandmaster of certain West Indian Lodges. Through his freemasonary activities he was made a Freeman of the City of London which, among other things, entitled him to drive a flock of sheep over London Bridge – an entitlement I don't believe he exercised.

Derek died on 19th February from an illness linked to his immune system, and was cremated at a private funeral on the 24th.

DR MICHAEL A GILKES

Michael Gilkes, who attended QC from 1943 to 1949, died of the Covid-19 virus in England on 19 April after three days in intensive care. Michael was a "late developer" (or perhaps he was not motivated by the educational curriculum) as he himself admitted in an email to me 18 years ago. I quote: "I was an undistinguished near-drop-out of Q.C. in the[...] 1940's. I got a scholarship to attend, but apart from Art [...] and English [...] I did poorly as a student." Having worked in various jobs, he then decided to come to Britain to study, gaining a BA (1st class honours) in English from London University in 1968, and subsequently a PhD from Kent in 1973.


Michael subsequently taught at a number of colleges and universities in the Caribbean, Canada and the UK. At the UWI campus in Barbados, he was Reader in English and Head of the English Department, one of the many QC alumni who held senior posts there.

Poet, actor, playwright, director, film maker and literary critic, Michael was winner of the Guyana Prize for Drama in 1992 and 2006, and of the Guyana Prize for Best Book of Poetry in 2002. In his email he described himself as "a roving, retired Caribbean cultural activist in the creative arts." He will be sadly missed.
